









Intercultural communication is a discipline that studies communication across different cultures and social groups, or how culture affects communication



Intercultural communication generally refers to interpersonal communication between individuals or groups who are affiliated with different cultural groups and/or have been socialized in different cultural (and, in most cases, linguistic) environments.

Cross-cultural communication

- comparison of communication behaviors and patterns in 2+ cultures
- Example: politeness norms or conflict negotiation strategies in Japanese vs. Irish management meetings

Intercultural communication

- investigation of interaction between people from linguistic and cultural backgrounds
- Example: South Korean university student in Seoul interacting in English with an exchange student from Sweden



 - Conflict and peace




